

How Can a Weary World Rejoice?

O Holy Night is one of my favorite Christmas songs, not just because the music itself often necessitates someone with powerhouse vocals to sing their heart out, but also because of the lyrics. From the very beginning of the song, the combination of the compelling music and lyrics stir in the listener's hearts a sense of expectation and hope, that maybe, just maybe, these worlds are true:

O Holy night! The stars are brightly shining It is the night of our dear Savior's birth Long lay the world in sin and error pining Til' he appeared and the soul felt its worth A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices For yonder breaks a new and glorious morn! Fall on your knees; O hear the angel voices! O night divine, O night when Christ was born O night, O holy night, O night divine!

But then the music stops, and we're left with a question. How can a weary world rejoice? Knowing what we know, seeing what we've seen, how could we possibly rejoice? We are each experiencing our own weariness, in our own lives and as we respond to what we are witnessing in the world. In the midst of war, violence, illness, hunger, poverty, a climate crisis, a housing crisis, a mental health crisis, an opioid crisis, another election cycle, and continued division, all alongside trying to keep up with the pace of life that never seems to slow down, we are weary. How could we possibly think of rejoicing?

This Advent, we'll be spending time in Luke's Gospel, where we find the birth narratives of John the Baptist and Jesus of Nazareth. It's in these two birth stories, filled with weariness, fear, connection and joy, that we find ways that a weary world can rejoice. Over these next several weeks, we will search in the Word for hope that we can hold onto in all of our weariness.

It's not only us, members of Redeemer and people who happen to be reading this newsletter, that are in need of hope and joy in a weary world. The whole world is weary, and there are, I'm sure, people in your life right now who are feeling weary and could use a word of hope. During this season, I invite us to do something that isn't the most "Lutheran" – invite people to church. The next few Sundays there will be postcards available for you to take with you and give to people you know. The postcards have information on the services that we will have throughout Advent alongside Sunday morning: Wednesday Evening Prayer, A Service for the Weary on the Longest Night, and our Christmas Eve service. This invitation to invite others is not with the intent of getting people in seats and money in plates– it's because we know that the world is weary and in need of hope. And we trust that whether the people we invite come or not, just the simple act of invitation will give others a glimpse of the hope and joy that God offers each of us.

In this Advent season, may we wait expectantly for our Savior, the one who gives us reason to feel joy. A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices!



Total Income for the month of October 2023 was below budget by \$(3,971). Offering income for October was \$(2,563) below budget. Total income YTD through October is below 2022 total income by \$(3,042). Total expenses for October were below budget by \$(6,177). Total Net Loss for October was \$(3,183) and YTD gain was \$1,516. October YTD gain was below 2022 by \$(23,640) and \$12,159 above budget YTD. Today, baby is getting lots of love and staying with Safe Families' host family while her mom, a full time student, works on finding a new home. The families visit weekly and mom breathes a sigh of relief, "*Without Safe Families, I wouldn't have my baby.*"
