Like the rhythms of the Ordinary Time season, a time of growth, and a season of holy days and festivals, where we are grounded in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. One of my favorite details within the liturgical calendar is that while the season of Lent, a time of repentance and fasting, is 40 days long, the season of Easter, a season of celebration and feasting, is 50 days long. During the season of Easter we are reminded through all of the lectionary readings, the Easter hymns, and even the length of the season, that abundant life in Jesus is always greater than sin and death. As we remember that Christ is risen, he is risen indeed, during this season of Easter, may we hold onto this incredible truth: that the abundant and eternal life that is found in our Savior Jesus the Christ is beyond even the powers of death. For the powers of death and sin have been defeated through Christ's glorious resurrection. Thanks be to God!



Total Income for the month of February 2024 was below budget by \$(3,350). Offering income for February was \$(3,010) below budget. Total income YTD through February is above 2023 total income by \$4,326. Total expenses for February were below budget by \$4,256. Total Net Loss for February was \$(1,378) and YTD gain was \$922. February YTD gain was below 2023 gain by \$(4,318) and \$5,740 better than budget YTD. Note that a Balance Sheet comparative of 2023 and 2024 account balances through February has been included again this month (see above). Thank you for your continuing financial support of Redeemer's mission. Please note that as we head further into 2024 there are still some financial concerns regarding the fact that the parsonage balance is now in the negative following all the recent upgrades to the facility. There are also multiple needs to the basic infrastructure of the church and grounds that will need to be addressed in the near future. As we all plan our budgets and contribution levels for 2024 please consider bumping your current giving levels to help achieve these necessary maintenance items for the church.
